ONE

(Uruk, any date. Funeral chant. INANNA and JESS enter. They both wear mourning. INANNA wears a gold circlet, indicating she is a god)

INANNA Duncan shouldn't be dead.

JESS You gods made us mortal, Inanna.

INANNA He's my husband.

JESS I'm not sure that changes anything.

(ENKI enters. He too wears a gold circlet)

INANNA Enki!

(She hugs him. **JESS** kneels)

ENKI Sorry I'm late. Wrong time zone. No need for

adoration today, Jess. Today I'm family.

INANNA Thanks for coming.

ENKI Not be here for my little sister?

INANNA Erashkigal isn't.

ENKI Rash might not be sure of her reception.

INANNA It's not me holding a grudge.

JESS I know you're gods and that, but there is a

funeral to finish. We should invoke Inanna's

help. I know that's you, but ...

INANNA What am I supposed to say to me?

JESS What you usually do. You haven't been pulling

sickies, have you?

INANNA Being a god is a busy life.

JESS Ask Erashkigal to welcome the dead to the Great

Beyond.

INANNA Rash's not speaking to us.

JESS We've been wasting our breath?

ENKI You've been making Erashkigal feel important.

She'll be your friend for death.

INANNA Rash, listen to me, please. Be kind to Duncan. If

you won't do it for me, think of Geshtininna here. They were twins. You see what it's like, Enki? People are needing their God. They'd get more help from a stone. At least it wouldn't be

crying all the time.

ENKI Busk it, Nina. They'll cope.

INANNA Asher's wetting his bed. Eight years old and king

of Uruk. And you say busk it?

JESS Do gods always chat at funerals?

INANNA I thought we'd finished.

JESS We haven't scattered the earth. (They pick up

some) The dust will carry your words to the Great

Beyond.

INANNA Take care of him, Erashkigal. You've always

wanted what I had.

ENKI You were a good king to your people.

JESS We're twins, Dudu. They can't keep us apart.

INANNA I want him back, Enki.

ENKI Of course.

INANNA Tell me how.

ENKI No can do, Nina. The laws of creation and all

that.

INANNA Gods made them and we're gods.

ENKI Not these laws. Duncan was born mortal; he has to

die.

INANNA I married him.

ENKI After he was born.

INANNA What's the use of being a god?

ENKI You still have your memories.

INANNA They'll give me a hug when I feel rotten? You're

so lucky, Jess. You'll follow him. Gods never

die.

JESS We really will be together again?

ENKI We don't have permission to answer that.

INANNA Stop bluffing, Enki. We've no idea what happens

in the Great Beyond.

JESS You're just saying that to stop me asking. That

isn't fair, Inanna.

ENKI Let me explain. When Father Anu divided creation

between the three of us, Erashkigal was left with the Great Beyond. We've heard nothing from her since. Not even an invitation to her nuptials.

INANNA Rash's married?

ENKI See?

JESS How do you know?

ENKI Facebook.

INANNA You didn't tell me.

ENKI When did I last see you?

INANNA Running love, war, chaos and an eight year old

takes time, you know.

ENKI He was a typical mortal husband - good looks,

more muscle than brain.

INANNA Duncan wasn't like that. Did you say was?

ENKI Last month. We weren't invited to the funeral

either.

INANNA Poor Rash. What am I saying? Duncan dies, where

does he go? To Rash. Her husband go? To Rash. That's not fair. She used to be big on fair.

ENKI Rash's a walking grievance sometimes, well, most

times, but she'd hate to see you unhappy.

INANNA She'd understand?

ENKI She's been through it herself.

INANNA She'd help?

ENKI You know Rash. She loves meddling.

INANNA Bless you, Enki. You always turn up when I need

you.

ENKI I wish I could drop balm on a broken heart. I

mean, god of wisdom and all that.

INANNA You've said what matters.

ENKI I'm glad. Must fly. They need my advice on

Brexit. (To JESS) Keep an eye on her, please.

(ENKI leaves. INANNA takes off her mourning

cloak)

JESS You can't give up mourning yet.

INANNA It's for Duncan. Where's my St Christopher?

JESS You're going somewhere?

INANNA Maybe.

JESS Erashkigal.

INANNA Ask no questions, get told no lies.

JESS She lives in the Great Beyond. Only the dead can

go there.

INANNA When sisters lose their husbands they should be

there for each other.

JESS She's not talking to you.

INANNA Shared grief heals all wounds. Find me something

sombre - but not too mourning. I don't want to

seem needy.

JESS You aren't wanting her to give back Duncan?

INANNA Maybe.

JESS We're taught Death doesn't give favours.

INANNA Gods don't ask. Travel kit.

(JESS brings a bum bag and checks the contents)

JESS Torch, phrasebook, mosquito coils, loperamide,

dollars. Lots of people go to the Great Beyond.

None of them come back.

INANNA They're mortals.

JESS Duncan's a mortal.

INANNA I'm not. Where's the identity bracelet Duncan

gave me?

JESS Won't she say no?

INANNA Duncan is her brother-in-law.

JESS I want to believe you. Really I do. But...

INANNA I could snap my fingers and this city would be

gone in an instant. Want me to prove it? (**JESS** shakes her head) Why do you think I can't to

change Duncan being dead?

JESS You're not the god of death.

INANNA Rash's bossy, but she doesn't mean to be cruel. I

just need to explain things.

JESS Enki tried that. The great river swept him back

and flooded the world. No-one could get insurance

for years.

INANNA I'm knocking on the door and asking nicely. If

Rash says come in, I'm her guest. If it's go

away, fine, I'll go away.

JESS That's a promise?

INANNA Stop fretting and find me a mirror.

(JESS finds one)

INANNA That will do nicely. Staff.

(INANNA takes it and practices her staff fighting

technique)

JESS You're sure you're just going to knock?
